In August, Richard went on a 7-day cruise to Cozumel, Mexico and the Caymans with his sister's family. He loved the food, watching Broadway shows on board, and shopping in port. He believes that his work in the church had influence on his ability to do this on his own. He said, "Every time you help somebody (less fortunate), you get double back." We are very proud of Richard and can't wait to see where he's going next. To that he said, "Wherever the Lord leads!"

Laurian recently graduated the EIP program and will continue her education at Ward Highlands Elementary in a Pre-K classroom. Her mom has promised to bring her back for frequent visits. We are so proud of Laurian and all of her accomplishments!

Hope Foundation Building Has a New Sign

The Nelle Needham Administration Building Houses Hope Foundation Offices

In the1970s when Nelle Needham served as Executive Director of ARC Marion, she learned the Florida Farm Bureau was about to tear down their building on Silver Springs Blvd. They told her they would donate the solid brick building to ARC Marion if she could find someone to move it all the way to the Maricamp campus. Nelle jumped at the chance to have it essentially for free and made the arrangements. The building housed ARC Marion's administrative offices for nearly three decades until the Heart of Florida Hope Foundation helped build the first new construction on campus, the Waliga Administration building, in 2004.

For the past three years, the Foundation's offices have been located in the very building their construction project replaced. With a new sign in place created by Amsden Signs, folks will be able to easily locate the Foundation's offices!

Group Home 2 Renovations Almost Complete

Campus Group Home Remodel Paid by Marion County Community Grant

Eleven of ARC Marion's most medically challenged clients will be welcomed into their new/old home the first week of November following the complete reconstruction of Group Home 2. One of two group homes built on the Maricamp campus in the 1980s has been totally remodeled to accommodate the special individuals, many of whom are in wheelchairs. The house is now state-of-the-art and fully handicapped accessible complete with all new wheelchair accessible bathrooms including roll-in showers.

Special thanks to the Marion County Board of County Commissioners for awarding us the Community Development Block Grant so that the much-needed renovations could be completed this year. Thanks also goes to Michelle Partin and Kay Kelly for their assistance in not only designing but redecorating the entire house to make it feel like a real home!
