Early Intervention Program Success Stories

Z. started in our program in April 2017 at the age of nineteen months. Z. always has a smile and is ready for whatever comes his way. He says 'no',' that',' all done',' toodles', 'wee' and 'bye'. Z. knows eight body parts and many clothing items. He loves circle time and knows the hand motions to all the songs. Z. is very social and loves playing and learning with his friends. Physical therapy activities focused on core strengthening, upright postural control, standing balance and providing opportunities to take independent steps. Z. is able to walk 20-25 feet and change direction by himself. Z. is very proud of himself and we are too!!!





I. is a happy and determined little girl who started our program in June 2017. I. is beginning to use some words such as 'mom', 'dad', 'ball', 'bumblebee', 'eat', 'papa', 'baby' and 'hi'. Her fine motor skills are great resulting in better coordination and visual scanning. I. is now able to sit by herself using only arm support. She can pull herself up to stand from a bench with assistance. She is also able to stand in a gait trainer and is beginning to take steps. I. continues to impress us all with the progress she has made so far this year. I. and her mom recently helped out with our presentation to the United Way.

What We Do

ARC Marion offers a variety of programs for clients with intellectual and developmental disabilities, ranging in age from 0-3 years in our Early Intervention Program to our Adult Day Training Program which serves individuals from age 25 and up. To highlight just one of the many programs offered here, clients in the ADT program are provided with vocational training through actual work experience. Companies in our community contract with us to do piece rate work with our clients. This allows them to grow skills at their own pace. We also travel to many of the contract companies where clients, accompanied by staff, do similar work out in the community. Community Employers benefit from contracting with us by reducing operating expenses, less management responsibilities and liabilities, having highly motivated workers and knowing they are making a difference for adults with disabilities.
